Delphine Roche is an author of art performances, mixing ballet dancers and athletes. Performed to a score by composer John Cage, Why Do We Sweat – A Cough or a Baby Crying Will Not Ruin a Good Piece of Modern Music puts the legacy of modernity in a critical perspective, confronting its theory with real bodies in today's French society. The piece has been shown at Palais de Tokyo, and twice at Galerie RX, in Paris.

The performance has recently been loosely adapted as a fashion editorial for Sport & Style magazine, and will go on living its own life, always new and different, as a reflection of the different contexts that will host it.


